BREEZEWOOD PG SPECIAL REPORT AT A CROSSROAD

Officials ponder the future of this unlikely maze of glitz and American consumerism

Ask Cory Divelbiss to describe the area where he lives and grew up, and he won't tell you what's around. He'll list what's no longer there.

Down the street from the Bob Evans Restaurant where Mr. Divelbiss, 32, works are the remains of Sky High Bar — now a mass of charred wood and metal.

One door over is the old Budget Inn, where ivy has

grown over a bright yellow "SALE/LEASE" sign on the vacant building.

Big Ed's Steakhouse used to be over by McDonald's. But it was torn down; he can't remember when.

This is Breezewood, Pa. — a stretch of fast-food joints and traffic lights that connects two major highways: Interstate 70 and the Pennsylvania Turnpike. Travelers heading west

Battle raging in takeover attempt

Nippon to boost effort as deadline approaches

Two years after Ukraine oligarch Ihor Kolomoisky was accused of taking over a steel plant in his country with an army of men wielding baseball bats, he moved millions of dollars into the United States to buy a Michigan steel factory in 2008 that once made parts for military aircraft.

He then went on to amass a steel fortune, buying factories in Kentucky, New York, Texas and elsewhere on his way to controlling a dozen mills, most of them purchased with money stolen from Ukraine's largest bank, U.S. prosecutors say.

A little-known but powerful federal panel created to screen such deals for national security risks raised no alarms at the time about the oligarch's enormous stake in the American steel industry.
